### Paid Union Meeting

A major campaign called It's Time - Kua Tae Te Wa has been launched by the NZEI to address issues created by at least a decade of under-resourcing of the education sector.

Issues include :

- current teacher shortage
- lack of resourcing for children with special needs

The campaign is focused on getting a significant investment to address these issues; and to renew the collective agreements for teachers and principals.

There is a second round of paid union meetings coming up this week. The NZEI have made the decision to hold these large scale meetings during student contact time to discuss ways to address the long-term, systemic issues that are facing education.

**School will remain open with a range of different activities run by school employees not attending the meeting.**

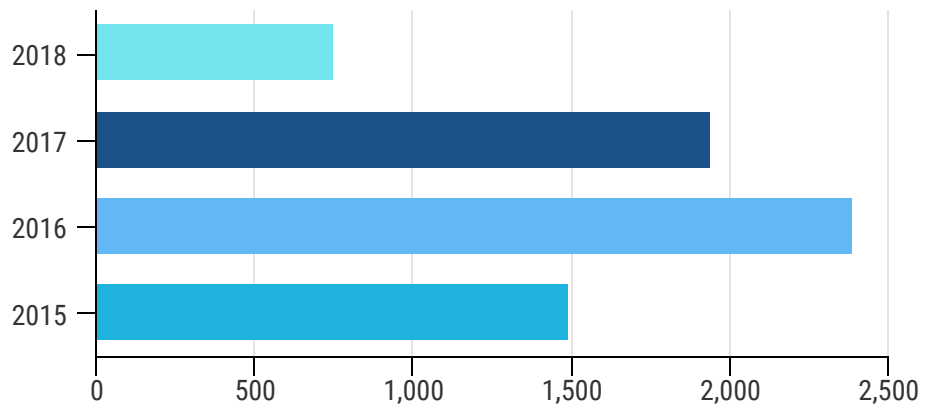
**You are welcome to collect your child at 12.40 (start of lunch time). Please inform the Office when you collect your child.**

## NEW SCHOOL UNIFORM FOR 2019



The BOT of St Joseph's Catholic School has approved a uniform change with the view of changing it at the start of 2019.

At St Joseph's developing pride is a key value of the school. Consultation with community and students taken during 2017 and 2018 provided us with feedback that a high standard of student appearance and presentation was wanted that would reflect the values of the school; and that the current cost of uniform was becoming a barrier; hence the change to a more modern uniform that is worn all year.

Managing this change will be done with care and respect. Uniforms will be available to purchase for 2019 from The Warehouse in Royal Oak. Students will be given a years grace in which they can continue to wear the current uniforms. By the start of 2020 every student of St Joseph's is expected to be in the new uniform.

At present St Joseph's buys in the school uniform and sells it to you. It is likely that some items may not be available during this time of transition. We ask that you communicate any uniform issues you may have with us so that we can make this change as smooth as possible.
